1. What are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed on your device when you visit a website. Cookies are then sent back to the originating website on each subsequent visit, or to another website that recognizes that cookie. Cookies enable a website like ours to recognize you or to store information about your actions and preferences to distinguish you from other users of the Sites and improve your online experience. Most websites contain elements from multiple web domains, meaning that when you visit a website your browser may receive cookies from several sources.

Cookies may be categorized as first- or third-party cookies, and persistent or session cookies:

- **First-party cookies** are those set by the Sites the user visits.
- **Third-party cookies** are set by a domain other than that of the Sites the user visits.
- **Persistent cookies** are cookies that remain on a user’s device for the period of time specified in the cookie.
- **Session cookies** are created temporarily, and once you close the browser, all session cookies are deleted.

2. How Can You Control or Delete Cookies?

We provide you with several ways to manage cookies:

- You can refuse to provide your consent to our collection of non-essential cookies;

Our performance and functionality Cookies are not strictly necessary for the Site to work but will provide you with a better browsing experience. You can delete or block these Cookies, but if you do this, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit the Site and some

features of the Site may not work as intended. For example, you may not be able to visit certain areas of the Site or you may not receive personalized information when you visit our Site.

If you do not wish to accept cookies in connection with your use of our Site, you will need to delete, and block or disable cookies; see below for more information on how to do this. Please note that disabling cookies likely will affect the functionality of our Site.

- You can disable first- or third-party cookies using your browser settings;

Most internet browsers are initially set up to automatically accept Cookies. If you do not want our website to store Cookies on your computer or device, you can change or adjust your browser or device settings to block Cookies or to alert you when Cookies are being sent to your device.

If you use different devices to view and access the Site (*e.g.*, your computer, smartphone, tablet, etc.) you will need to ensure that each browser on each device is adjusted to suit your Cookie preferences.

The procedures for changing your settings and cookies differ from browser to browser. If necessary, use the help function on your browser or click on one of the links below to go directly to the user manual for your browser.

3. What Types of Cookies Does the Company Use?

We use different types of session and persistent cookies to run our Sites. Some or all of the cookies identified below may be stored in your browser.

Type of Cookie Description

<p>Strictly Necessary Cookies</p>	<p>Strictly Necessary cookies are necessary for the operation of our Sites. These cookies are essential in helping you to move around our Sites and use the features, such as accessing secure areas of the Sites or using the shopping basket. For example, we may use Strictly Necessary cookies to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remember the goods and services you selected when you get to the payment page • Identify you as being logged into the Sites • Provide access to protected areas of a Sites • Remember previously entered text so it is not lost if the page refreshes
<p>Performance Cookies</p>	<p>Performance cookies simply help us improve the way our Sites work. We utilize these cookies to analyze how our visitors use our Sites and to monitor our Sites performance. They tell us how people use each page, which ones are most commonly viewed, or whether any errors occurred. This allows us to provide a high-quality experience and quickly identify then fix any issues that arise. For example, we may use Performance cookies to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Store preferences to see which method of linking between pages is most effective • Enable web analytics to provide anonymous statistics on how our Sites are used • To assist with error management in helping us improve the Sites by measuring any errors that occur
<p>Functionality Cookies</p>	<p>We use Functionality cookies to allow us to remember your preferences. For example, we may use Functionality cookies to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remember settings you have applied such as layout, colors, font sizes and page backgrounds • Remember if we have already asked you if you want to fill in a survey • Detect if you have already seen a pop-up to ensure it doesn't get shown to you again • Process a request from a user to submit a comment or blog or forum post
<p>Third-Party Cookies</p>	<p>We allow third parties to download cookies to your device in order to provide enhanced functionality to you, such as sharing content with others, providing real-time news and information about our company for our investors, or tracking usage patterns on the Sites.</p>
